3. CANINE GOOD CITIZEN TEST

This is a pass/fail test. All dogs receiving a qualifying score will receive a Certificate from the American Kennel Club. (\$5.00 certificate fee). The test is open to both purebred and mixed breed dogs. Dogs must pass all 10 tests to qualify.

Canine Good Citizen Test is open to all. There is a \$5.00 fee for non 4-H'ers.

Test #1. ACCEPT A STRANGER. Dog must allow a stranger to approach and talk with handler.

Test #2. SIT FOR EXAMINATION. Dog must remain sitting next to handler and allow evaluator to touch it.

Test #3. APPEARANCE AND GROOMING. Dog must be in good condition, clean and healthy. Owner must show proof of rabies vaccination and license. Dog must allow evaluator to brush it, check ears, and pick up feet.

Test #4. WALK ON LOOSE LEASH. Dog may walk on either side and follow through turns and halts.

Test #5. WALK THROUGH A CROWD. Dog must walk on a loose leash, passing close to other people.

Test #6. SIT AND DOWN ON COMMAND/STAYING IN POSITION. Handler may use more than one command, but cannot force the dog into position.

Test #7. COMING WHEN CALLED. Dog is on a 20' line. Handler walks 10 feet away and calls the dog.

Test #8. REACTION TO ANOTHER DOG. Two handlers and dogs will approach from opposite directions, stop and shake hands. Neither dog should go to the other dog or handler.

Test #9. REACTION TO DISTRACTIONS. Dog should not panic, run away, bark or show aggression. Distractions may include a jogger, person on a bicycle, group of people talking loudly and shoving each other, person with a shopping cart.

Test #10. DOG LEFT ALONE. Dog will be held by an evaluator on a six foot line (provided) while handler goes out of sight for 3 minutes. Dog may move, but should not bark, whine, howl or pace.

4. WRITTEN TEST

Questions are based on the AKC books Dog Care and Training and The Complete Dog and on the 'Big E' 4-H Rules and Regulations. Emphasis this year is on the Terrier group, Earth Dog, and Barn Hunt.

5. TIMED AGILITY COURSE

Tunnels, jumps and weave poles.

- C. Overall– will be awarded based on scores in showmanship classes C, D, or E; obedience classes B, C, D, E, F, or G and written test combined.
- D. The representative to the Premier Showman contest must be a New London County 4-H'er. In the event that the senior showman champion is from another county, the next highest placing New London County 4-H'er will be the Premier Showman representative.
