- Health papers will be checked, current rabies vaccination and Coggins Test required (as appropriate for species).
- Three persons per team will be admitted without charge at the Gate.
- Contestants compete at their own risk.
- The use of alcoholic beverages on the Fairgrounds will result in disqualification.
- Good sportsmanship and conduct is expected. All pullers are required to sign the 4-H Code of Conduct to participate.
- Any poor sportsmanship or inappropriate actions will be grounds for disqualification by the Superintendent's discretion and backed by a mentor.

All non-New London County 4-H entries are required to sign the 4-H Code of Conduct to participate.
